**Although this summer time is incredibly so hot, MOGSS didn't hesitate to organize the Yangon – Mandalay Expressway CSR Campaign as requested by Yangon-Mandalay Expressway Maintenance Unit. The full story of this CSR activity is as follows:**

### MOGSS YANGON-MANDALAY EXPRESSWAY CSR CAMPAIGN

On December 24, 2015, MOGSS organized a **YANGON-MANDALAY EXPRESSWAY CSR CAMPAIGN** for the first time. The objectives for the CSR Campaign is to educate the drivers ( especially Express Bus Drivers ) and the passengers for Safe Drive to relegate the accidents occurred along the Expressway.

Before the Campaign, MOGSS CEC Members and Head of Office visited Yangon-Mandalay Expressway Officials. Based on the site visit information and CSR Campaign Meeting discussions, MOGSS prepared Gifts, Pocket Guides and arrangement with diligence within few days.

MOGSS had a special meeting for CSR Campaign and decided to emphasize three points including (1) To follow Speed Limit ( 100 KM / Hour Maximum ) (2) To fasten Seat Belt all the driving time and (3) To avoid use of hand phones while driving. MOGSS offered commemorative gifts during CSR Campaign to attract drivers and passengers. Those gifts are intended to remind the rules and regulations for Expressway. A Sporty Cap stitched with MOGSS Logo and Mottos for Safety Drive, Key Chain with Safety Mottos for Driving and Pocket Guide with important Expressway Police Phone Numbers for Emergency Cases.



To simplify the CSR Campaign Objectives, the mottos initiated are

**(1) Safe Drive – Save Lives , (2) No Seat Belt – No Safety and (3) No Phone – More Safe.**

With the strong support of the MOGSS Members, MOGSS organized MOGSS Expressway CSR Campaign to educate Highway Drivers, Driving Crews and Passengers for safe driving, seat belt wearing, avoiding cell phone use and care taking along the highway, offering gifts with mottos for safe driving and pocket guides with do and don't for safe drive. MOGSS CSR Campaign members also explain about road safety and accidents to drivers and passengers and response from the Expressway Drivers and Passengers for this campaign is very positive and some drivers and passengers demanded to organize such campaign as far as possible preferably during rainy season. During the campaign, about 65 Highway Buses, 120 Sedan and Vans, 35 Light Trucks, 25 Trucks and more than 2,000 passengers were organized and most of them came back with very constructive and encouraging reactions. Only very few, say less than 10 vehicles, did not join the campaign.



This remarkable campaign was considered very successful and expected to reorganize during 2016 with solid cooperation of MOGSS Member Companies and even with Operators and Foreign Oil and Gas related companies. MOGSS is very pleased with the campaign and extremely confident to move forward the further CSR Programs during 2016.

Based on this successful 1<sup>st</sup>. Campaign and request by the Expressway (Maintenance) Unit, MOGSS reorganized the 2<sup>nd</sup>. Yangon-Mandalay Expressway CSR Campaign on 24-April-2016. This time, about one hundred MOGSS Members led by Chairman U Kyaw Kyaw Hlaing, Secretary U Aung Ye Soe, Advisor U Kyi Soe and well-wishers join the campaign and MOGSS was even supported by well-known Operators such as TOTAL E&P and PTTEP. ## MYANMA OIL AND GAS .....

### Historical Background



The country now known as **Myanmar**, sandwiched in between China and India, two of the world's biggest new sources of energy demand, was one of the world's first oil producer, with some exports as early as 1853. Foreign investment followed, with sizable fields developed in the late 1800s and early 1900s. Myanmar is believed to have significant untapped reserves of natural gas and Myanmar is the largest gas exporter in Southeast Asia.

Between 1886 and 1962, the country's oil industry was dominated by Burmah Oil Company (**BOC**), which discovered the **Yenangyaung** oil field in 1887 and the **Chauk** oil field in 1902. Both are still in production.

In 1962, the oil and gas industry was nationalized. Until the late 1980s, the government kept foreign operators away. From 1962 to 1988, oil exploration and production were mainly performed by MOGE; foreign operators were kept out by a strict nationalistic policy and the lack of an appropriate legal framework. But beginning in 1988, it liberalized the oil and gas sector to begin allowing outside investment again. Western companies including Total S.A. and Unocal Corporation, later bought by Chevron, entered the market. As in many other countries, the State assumed ownership of the resources, either operating them itself or delegating this task to private operators, who were paid for their outlay and work in oil or gas under Production Sharing Contracts (**PSCs**).

After a few years, a host of investors from Asia and elsewhere expanded their operations, including CNOOC Ltd. of China and South Korea's Daewoo International. The process intensified after 2004, as Myanmar authorities accelerated the opening of areas for exploration. By 2007, at least 27 companies from 13 countries, including Petronas of Malaysia, PTTEP of Thailand, Total E&P of France and ONGC of India, were active in Myanmar's oil and gas industry.



Although major discoveries of oil have been limited, companies have found sizable deposits of natural gas, which now makes up the bulk of Myanmar's production. Foreign companies are particularly interested in offshore areas along Myanmar's western coast in the Bay of Bengal near Bangladesh, where a consortium including Daewoo has developed a major gas asset that will include a pipeline to China.

The key player of oil and gas policy in Myanmar is the **Ministry of Energy (MOE)**, which has oversight for three state-owned enterprises:

- Myanmar Oil and Gas Enterprise (**MOGE**), formed in 1963, is responsible for oil and gas exploration and production, as well as domestic gas transmission through a 1,200-mile onshore pipeline network.
- Myanmar Petrochemical Enterprise (**MPE**) operates three small refineries, three fertilizer plants and a number of other processing plants.
- Myanmar Petroleum Products Enterprise (**MPPE**) is responsible for retail and wholesale distribution of petroleum products.

**Note** : The ministry was reformed as **Ministry of Electricity and Energy (လျှပ်စစ်နှင့်စွန့်အားဝန်ကြီးဌာန)** by the new government in 2016.

In 2007, nine foreign oil companies were permitted in 16 onshore blocks to explore new areas, to enhance recovery from existing fields, to reactivate fields where production had been suspended and to produce oil and gas.

In the offshore, majors companies including Shell, ENI, ConocoPhillips, Statoil, Ophir, BG, Chevron, Total, Oil India and Woodside are exploring and/or developing in 31 blocks since 2014.


Since late 2004, Myanmar's authorities have intensified the opening of blocks to foreign companies. Myanmar's oil output is small, with gas taking over. The country produces around 180, 000 barrels of oil equivalent per day, of which 90% is gas.





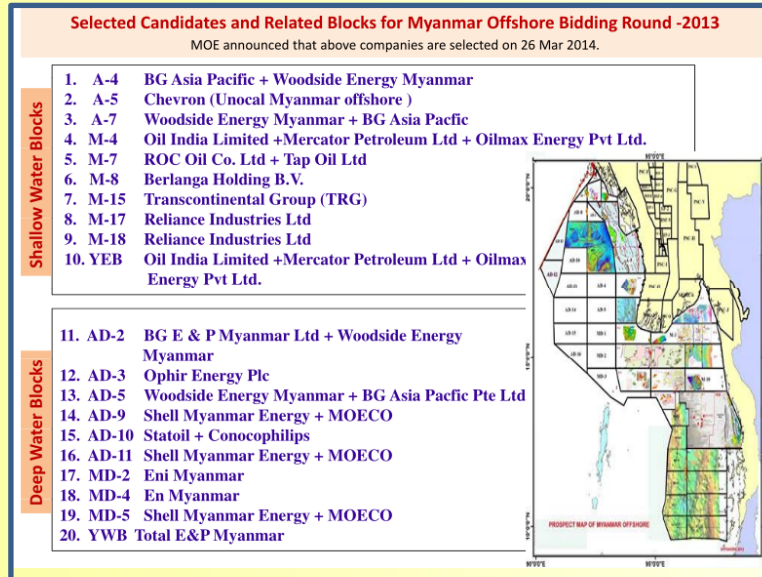

### Supply Bases for Oil and Gas Operation

Currently, **TWO** Offshore Supply Bases (OSB) exist in Myanmar.

- (1) Tharkayta OSB in Yangon which is very limited space and shallow water draft.
  - (2) Kyaukphyu OSB
  - (3) Singapore International Supply Base and Thailand Ranong Base are used for Cargo Loading and Offloading cargo. ( Outside Myanmar)
- For onshore, MOGE supply bases are situated along the Ayarwaddy river.

### Potential Opportunities in Myanmar Oil & Gas Sector

Myanmar government and business community is keen to diversity their commercial partners. More services for E&P of onshore and offshore blocks are on the way. Seismic Data Acquisition Consultancy for the Oil & Gas and Mining industries is a must. Environmental and Social Impact Consultancy in the area of Oil & Gas, Mining, Large Scale Development Projects such as SEZs, airports, seaports and so on are in demand. As Myanmar oil and gas sector is growing significantly, the Supply Chain Services are essential in many areas including Equipment, Materials, Accessories, Training and Skill Accreditation, Research and Development.

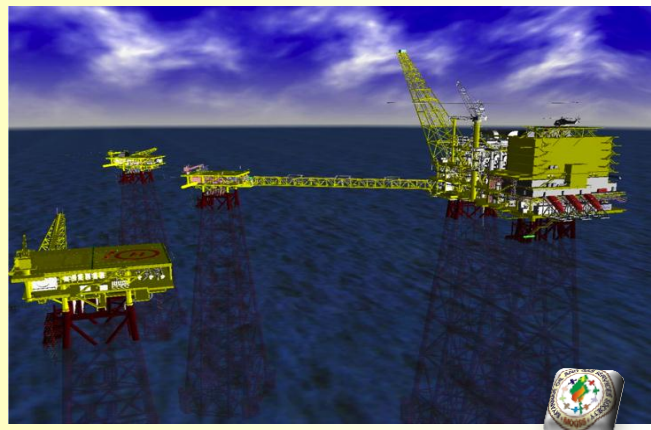
